
The Festival unveils the lineup of its US Tour 2019, in the special presence of the comedian and director Océan.



After its 8th edition (June 18 - June 25), Champs-Elysées Film Festival, an essential event to discover the best of French and American independent cinema, now presents the program of its retrospective in North America: the US Tour. Since its inception in 2017, the US Tour of Champs-Elysées Film Festival offers the American public a retrospective of its French film selection with advanced screenings of the «New French Generation» in America.

As a result of the success of this project and the enthusiasm of audience members, the third edition of the US Tour will be held over one month, from October 10 to November 10, 2019, in five American cities: Chicago, Austin, Los Angeles, Vancouver and Portland, where shorts and features from the French selection will be screened. These films were part of the main competition last June during the 8th edition of the festival in Paris. The US Tour will continue in January 2020 in Minneapolis.

«Our goal with the US Tour is to expand what we have achieved in France to the United States. During the Champs-Elysées Film Festival, we allow young independent American cinema to meet the French audience, and during the US Tour, young French artists meet an American audience. It is our vision and commitment to create a genuine cultural exchange between these two countries. «

Océan is a former member of the jury and the director of the eponymous documentary Océan, which had its international premiere during the latest edition of the Champs-Elysées Film Festival. He will support the third edition of this American retrospective. A highlight of his participation will be a special screening of his documentary, the opening film of the retrospective in Portland on November 8, 2019 and followed by a Q&A with the audience. A debate about «Transidentity and Feminism» with Ocean will take place at the Portland State University the same day.

Océan will also participate on November 9 in a discussion on Independent Cinema. Océan's participation has been made possible by Unifrance.

ABOUT CHAMPS-ÉLYSÉES FILM FESTIVAL

A major international film festival, Champs-Élysées Film Festival is Paris' essential event to discover the best independent French and American cinema. The 8th edition took place from June 18 to June 25, 2019 in all the theaters on the most beautiful avenue in the world. It offered a competitive selection of French and American films (features and short films), advanced screenings, and an eclectic musical lineup. The festival has welcomed prestigious guests of honor such as Jeff Goldblum, Debra Granik, Kyle Maclachlan, and Christopher Walken.

Created by producer, distributor, and exhibitor Sophie Dulac, the festival brings together more than 25,000 audience members and professionals every year on the Champs-Élysées. For a week, the festival showcases the heart of contemporary filmmaking by presenting bold, unreleased and ambitious films.

Champs-Elysées Film Festival will open its call for entries in November for the 9th edition that will take place from June 16 to 23, 2020.

ABOUT OCÉAN, SPONSOR OF THE 2019 US TOUR OF CHAMPS-ELYSÉES FILM FESTIVAL

Océan, transgender comedian, came out publicly in May 2018.

He first started as a musician named Oshen, and released three albums with V2 / Polydor until 2007. As Oceanerosemarie, he played his one-man-show The Invisible Lesbian for over four years, with 500 show dates and 40,000 tickets sold from 2009 to 2014. He then created his second one-man-show Violent Kitten, which met the same success since 2015 and ran until February 2019.

In the meantime, Océan wrote and co-directed *Kiss me!* with Cyprien Vial, a lesbian romantic comedy in which he stars as the protagonist alongside Alice Pol and Michèle Laroque (produced by Nolita Cinéma).

He collaborated on the dialogues of the film *Aurore* by Blandine Lenoir with Agnès Jaoui, and the play *L'Ombre de la baleine* written by and starring Mikaël Chirinian.

He has also contributed as a columnist on France Inter and Arrêt sur Images between 2013 and 2017. He has released several books, *The Guide to Homosexual Marriage* in 2012 (Ed. La Martinière), *The invisible Lesbian* in comics (Ed. Delcourt), *My Lesbian Kitchen* (Ed. Des Ailes sur un tracteur).

In 2018, he acted in *Justice*, a play by Samantha Markowic at the Théâtre de l'Œuvre, costarring Naidra Ayadi and Camille Cottin. He directed the theatrical production of *The Invisible Lesbian* with the actress Marine Baousson reprising his role. He also directed the eponymous documentary series *Océan* for France Televisions / Slash.







































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
